## Cite a specific nest

Use the following format to cite a specific nest:

- [Nest Name]. Nested Knowledge, Inc. *link to nest* Access Date.

For example:

- COVID-19 RCTs - Phase I. Nested Knowledge, Inc.

## In Text Citations

We recommend referencing use of Nested Knowledge in your article method sections for transparency. The following examples statement can be modified and incorporated into your review:

- We performed this study using a novel semi-automated software platform (AutoLit, Nested Knowledge, Saint Paul, MN)
- Before formal statistical analyses, we used the Nested Knowledge automated data analysis feature to visually summarize potentially significant findings.
- The Nested Knowledge AutoLit living review platform was utilized to identify randomized control trials published between [2010 and 2021] reporting [XYZ]
- Detailed results of our study search, screening, and data extraction process are hosted on the 101 Nested Knowledge website [x].
