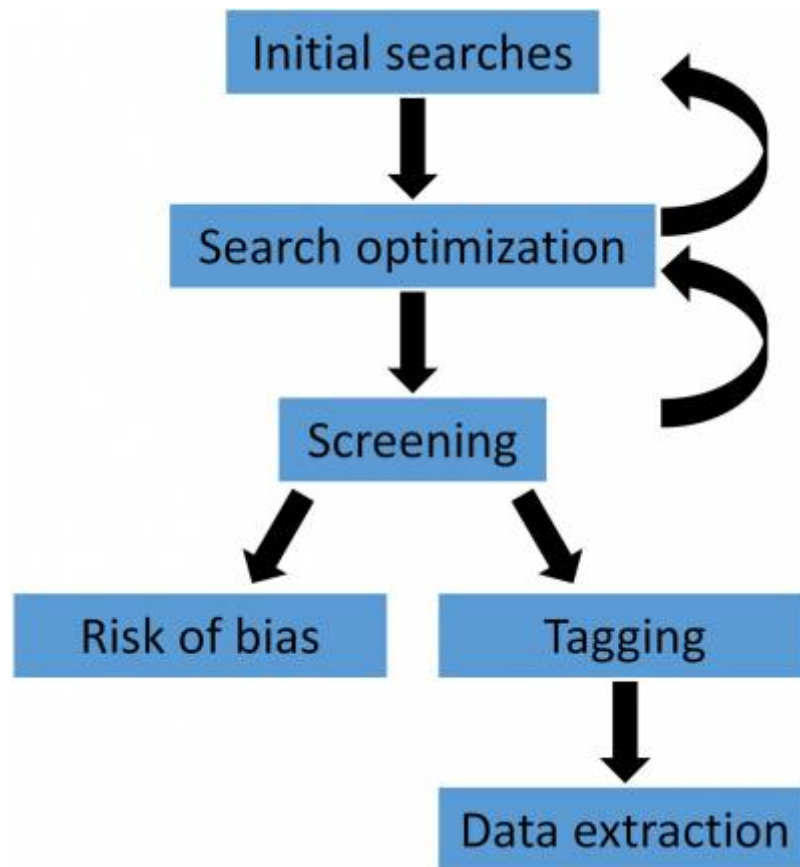
Best Practices for Data Extraction
